Examples of Logistical Services

Read these examples. Sometimes these are performed by in-house staff.

Other times they are contracted out to professional transportation/logistics firms.



<u>Truckload Services</u> – This is a very common method of moving freight in North America. Even so, many people don't think about the wide variety of shipments made through full truckloads. "*Dry Van*" shipments provide security and basic weather protection for freight. "*Temperature control and refrigerated*" services are often needed for food-based shipments. "*Flatbed*" hauling can transport items that can't be hauled (or don't fit) in a dry van. "*Oversized and heavy-haul freight*" is a specialized service some transportation companies provide. When companies already own their own trailers, a service called "*power only*" provides drivers of and power to pull the trailers.

<u>Less-Than-Truckload Shipping</u> – When a shipment is larger than a parcel, but isn't large enough to qualify as an entire truckload, less-than-truckload (LTL) shipping may be the best option. Often, these types of shipments are "palletized."

<u>Intermodal Services</u> – by definition, intermodal shipping is when two or more forms of transportation are used for a given shipment. For example, rail cars might transport a shipment across the country, and then trucks may take that inventory to the final destination. Intermodal logistics services often use containers to make it easier to lift/move the cargo from a railcar (for example) to a truck.

<u>Other services</u>. There are many more varieties of logistics services. A few worth noting and remembering including: Warehousing and Distribution, Time-Critical and Expedite Solutions, International Shipping, Trade Show Shipping, Final Mile Services, Retail Logistics, Premium Logistics Services for delicate equipment or expensive items requiring additional care during movement, and even Moving Services.




